### **Notes on Nursing AAS**

- The Nursing Program is a challenging and rigorous curriculum. It is intellectually challenging and students must be able to critically think. Students must have strong math and science background to be successful.
- A GPA of 2.5 or better is required to enter the Nursing Program. GPA will be calculated at the end of Spring semester for Fall entry and the end of Fall semester for Spring entry.
- A grade of C+ (77) is required in all nursing courses for the AAS in Nursing and in BIO 107, BIO 108, and BIO 113. Grades less than C+ (77) in the above courses cannot be used to fulfill the program requirements.
- Required nursing courses for the AAS in Nursing may be repeated once. Students who do not achieve a C+ when repeating a required nursing course will be withdrawn from the Nursing Program. Additionally, only one (1) required Nursing course may be repeated.
- Students may only withdraw from a required nursing course one time.
- Students may opt to take Math 167 or take a Math Proficiency Exam. Students can schedule this exam with the Health Sciences Division Secretary. Students should take the proficiency exam prior to entering N100 and N101. Math 167 may be taken concurrently with N100 and N101.
- Students must successfully complete the nursing courses in the semester they are currently in prior to beginning another semester in nursing.
- Nursing Electives can be chosen from any nursing course not required in the curriculum. N150, N 218 and any nursing 120 elective meet this requirement.
- Transfer students must meet the 2.5 GPA to enter the Nursing Program and have a grade C+ (77) or better and in BIO 107, BIO 108, and BIO 113 and any transfer nursing courses. Grades being transferred will be used to calculate GPA for admission.
- Graduates of practical nursing programs may be granted advanced standing in the Nursing Program. Please contact the secretary of the Health Sciences Division for further information.
- Admission and continuation in this program are conditional upon completion of the required annual physical examination, TB test, CPR Certification (Adult, Child and Infant) and personal professional liability insurance. Two(2) MMR's, Tetanus, Hepatitis B, Varicella immunizations (2) or documented proof of Chicken Pox are required for all students. Forms are available from the faculty secretary's office in the Health Sciences Division.
- Preference for admission will be given to students who have completed required sciences courses (BIO 107 and BIO 108). Students will be waitlisted according to GPA and the above.
- After completing N100 and N101 students may opt to go on to take N102 and N103 or N104.
- Nursing 100 and 101 must be taken together.
- Students not meeting the C+ requirement in BIO 107, BIO 108, and BIO 113 may repeat these courses one time to achieve the required grade. Students who do not achieve the C+ after repeating a BIO course are ineligible to enter nursing. Students transferring BIO credits must meet the same requirements.
- N202 Professional Issues and Leadership and Management is taken in the final semester of nursing.
