




ACCESS THE MATH LAB

- ... and so much more!




TRY CAREER & TRANSFER EXPLORATION

APPLY TO EOP



The **Educational Opportunity Program** (EOP) is a state-funded program for New York State Residents who are educationally and economically disadvantaged. The primary objective is to help provide educationally related services to students whose educational and economic circumstances have limited their educational opportunities.

Benefits:

- Dedicated advisor through graduation
- Individualized tutoring
- EOP Summer Bridge Program, a four-week college orientation program
- Access to technology lending
- Mentoring
- Direct Aid

Eligibility:

- New York state resident for 12 months before admission
- First-time full-time college student
- Graduate of a New York state high school with a GPA between 70 and 84, or recipient of a GED/TASC
- Transfer student previously enrolled in EOP/HEOP/College Discovery/SEEK at another college



The Fitness Center is **open to current SUNY Adirondack students, faculty and staff**. A valid SUNY Adirondack ID is required to gain access into the Fitness Center. FOCUS ON HEALTH & WELLNESS

The Mobile Health Center is onsite the **2nd and 4th Thursday of every month from 9am-4pm** (located in the parking lot next to the Residence Hall).




With a Veterans Resource Center on campus, SUNY Adirondack supports America's military heroes with valuable services for college success and beyond. In addition to helping veterans navigate college admissions and financial aid, our veterans benefits advisor offers:

MAINTAINING FINANCIAL AID ELIGIBILITY STUDENTS MUST MEET REQUIRED SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS GUIDELINES.



Each of these scenarios decrease financial aid in the *current* semester; grant & scholarship aid is the reduced first.

- Classes must be required for the degree to be eligible for financial aid.
- Students must attend all classes throughout each semester in order to receive aid for them.
- Faculty are required to report if/when students stop attending a class.

THIS DOESN'T HAVE TO HAPPEN TO YOU!



- Meet with your advisor to register each semester to ensure you are on track with your degree and enrolling in only required classes
- Don't change your schedule without meeting with an advisor
- Understand professor's attendance policies for each course
- ➤ If you are considering dropping a class be sure to meet with your financial aid advisor to determine what impact this may have on your financial aid
- ➤ Best bet: keep attending the classes you enroll in if you're struggling with coursework talk to your professor, advisor, a counselor, tutoring, accessibility services, etc.

FINANCIAL AID FACTS



Important Financial Aid Information

- If students get an X-grade prior to the college census date (after the first 3 weeks of the semester), students lose NYS TAP & cannot get part-time NYS TAP
- If students are eligible for the PELL Grant, and are X'd from a class, the PELL Grant is adjusted based on the number of credits they are enrolled in at the census date (first 3 weeks). It is not adjusted after state cert (3 + weeks)
- If students are reported as a "no show" in all classes, they lose all aid (loans, Pell, and TAP)
- Students must be enrolled in AT LEAST 6 credits when loans are disbursed (even if they are approved for loans). The college will send the loan back and the student will be billed directly.
- Students who live on campus that receive <u>full</u> financial aid will still have a bill.
