# **College Timeline**

Date	Event
1958	A group of Warren County citizens, encouraged by County Supervisors, raise the
	idea of a local community college, and meet with the Dean of Community
	Colleges of the State University of New York to discuss what could be done. An
	Action Committee is formed of both Warren and Washington County citizens,
	who then survey local students and their parents to determine their educational
	needs.
1960	The Action Committee presents its recommendation to the Board of Supervisors
	in both counties and asks that they jointly sponsor the new college. The resolution
	is passed, and in June the formation of the college is approved by the Trustees of
	the State University of New York. In fall of the same year, Adirondack
	Community College is selected as the official name of the future college.
1961	In February, The Adirondack Community college Board of Trustees appoints Dr.
	Charles R. Eisenhart as President of the college.
	In March, a location on Lower Main Street Hudson Falls is selected as the
	temporary campus location, with physical education classes to take place in the
	nearby YMCA facilities.
	On September 12, Adirondack Community College opens the first day of classes
	with 215 students enrolled full-time. The college's Opening Convocation takes

## Fall 2021 Fast Facts Notes

The Fall 2021 Fast Facts are comprised of census numbers as of October 18, 2021, derived from the SIRIS (SUNY Institutional Research Information System) system. Final Census numbers will be reported in the Fall 2022 Early Edition. Fall retention rates on pages 28-32 are end-of-term fall to fall retention rates except for Fall 2020 returning in Fall 2021 rate (census retention rates).

Fall 2020 data points vary greatly in comparison to prior and subsequent fall semester numbers due to the instructional delivery changes the college made in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and the impact of COVID-19 on student enrollment behavior.

**SUNY Adirondack Saratoga** Previously reported Wilton Center numbers are reported under the SUNY Adirondack Saratoga location.

FTE Definition All FTE (Full-time Equivalent) numbers are based on 30 credits hours = 1 FTE.

**Cross-Registered Students** Enrollment numbers include inbound cross-registered students who are enrolled in SUNY Adirondack courses. Credits for SUNY Adirondack students who cross-register at other SUNY institutions (outbound) are excluded. Exception: The peer comparison headcount chart on page 19 *excludes* inbound cross-registered students.

**Age Calculation** Age is calculated on a student's age at the end of the semester because this is the age of the student when a student achieves or does not achieve a credential.

**The Four Disciplines of Execution (4DX)** 4DX is a continuous improvement program developed by Franklin Covey, Inc. SUNY Adirondack first implemented 4DX in 2017. The four disciplines include: 1) focus on a wildly important goal (WIG), 2) act on the lead measures, 3) keep a visible and compelling scoreboard, and 4) create a cadence of accountability. Degrees earned are counted from September 1, Year 1 through August 31, Year 2 to match the fiscal year.

**Student Outcomes – Diversity, Equity and Inclusion** Graduation rates, fall to fall retention rates, and average credits earned by first-time, full-time students are reported by Pell status, gender, disability, race/ethnicity, and permanent residence.

First-Time Full-Time and First-Time Part-Time Participation Rates by County High School: Fall 2017 - Fall 2020 and Fall 2021 Enrollment


